She introduced attendees.

Alan Tuckett, President, International Council for Adult Education (on Skype from the United Kingdom) gave a presentation about the International Council for Adult Education and adult education in the UK. He participated in a conversation about collaborations and offered to assist COLLO members in re-establishing international exchanges between adult and continuing educator in the UK and elsewhere with those in the US.

Barbara Board, Ph.D., Principal, BaBoard, LLC District Extension Director, Emerita, Virginia Tech, gave a presentation entitled, *Exploring the Nature and Experience of Collaboration: Research and practice-- An inextricably intertwined partnership*.
